The beginning of the program will have welcomes from several persons and concludes with a Rededication Ceremony for all Brothers attending.

CONCLAVE ARROW SHOW

The feathers will fly in the Council Ring Saturday. It's the Conclave Arrow Show and you shall long remember it. An informative National Conference slide presentation, the Section Superior Ceremonial Team presentation and Team and Individual Dance competitions are the evening's highlights. Don't miss it!

WORSHIP SERVICE

We shall welcome Mr. Phil Kearse, Director of Christian Education at St. John's United Methodist Church in Aiken, SC. Philis a Sum Cum Laude graduate of Wofford College and Yale Divinty School. Let us all remember "A Scout is Reverent."

- persons shall be accepted for competitions excetpt those permitted by ruling of the judges.
- All contestants and teams must be on time and ready to perform in their categories when judging starts. Once competition has started, no one will be allowed to start late.
- 3. Each lodge will appoint two judges knowledgeable in Indian Events. One will judge Ceremonial Competition and the other all additional competitions. It must be noted that these judges should be capable in ceremonial, costuming and dancing areas. If a lodge feels it does not have a capable person, then one should not be appointed. However, it must be understood that the other judges shall be fair and unbaised in all activities.
- 4. Efforts to keep the program on schedule will necessitate not all judges evaluating in all categories. This rule is interpreted as stating that during costume competition one-half of the judges will evaluate each category and one-half of the judges will evaluate the ceremonial and pow wow competitions respectively. The selection of judges for the various categories will occur through random selection.
- 5. All judges' decisions shall be considered final in all matters. Any inquiries concerning this policy should be directed to the Indian Events Coordinator first and then to the Section Chief and Section Adviser.
- All participants must be under age 21.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Special Events add more flavor and enjoyment to the program of our Conclave. Several new special events such as the Outdoor Fair, Open Forums, Brotherhood Wide Game and several new awards have been included inour 1979 program. Below are listed the General Quest for the Golden Arrow rules. Detailed rules for each competition are available from your Lodge Chief or at program headquarters in the Gu-Que Cabin. Rules for all events will be read before the beginning of each compettion.

- Each lodge is expected to enter each event.
- One person may enter only two events with the Tug of War (if elected).
- 3. There will be 12 points awarded for first place, 11 for second, 10 for third and so on down to sixth place.

- 4. A revolving trophy will be awarded to the lodge with the highest total score during the Closing Assembly.
- 5. All judging will be final. Any inquires concerning this rule will be directed first to the Special Events Coordinator, and then to the Section Chief and Section Adviser.

CONCLAVE CODE OF CONDUCT

The general welfare of any group depends on the conduct of the individual members. This ensures the success of our Conclave and provides the maximum benefit to every participant. As an Arrowman, I understand this and support the reasonable demands of conduct expected of me.

As a member of the order of the Arrrow and participant in the 1979 Section V.Conclave, I will:

- 1. Observe the Scout Oath, the Scout Law, the Explorer Code and the Order of the Arrow Obligation.
- Wear my official and complete uniform throughout the Conclave. Unofficial hats, patch jackets or decorations are not a part of my official uniform.
- 3. Attend all planned training and general sessions.
- 4. Be personally responsible for breakage, damage or loss of property.
- 5. Observe quiet hours and lights out from 12:00 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.
- 6 Keep my quarters clean, my bed made and dispose of trash in the proper places.
- 7. Not change my officially assigned campsite without permission from Conclave Headquarters in the Gu-Que Cabin.

 The reason: Emergency calls, for example, could not be delivered if changes were unofficial.
- 8. Allow no unregistered person to occupy my campsite.
- 9. Wear suitable covering to the shower houses.
- 10. Understand that the purchase, possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illicit drugs at the Conclave will not be permitted. This standard shall apply to all participants, both youth and adult.
- 11. Respect the state laws and the Council regulations prohibiting the use of fireworks, firearms and gambling. Infractions of these regulations will be cause for immediate dismissal from the 1979 Conclave.
- 12. Respect the rule prohibiting the use of private autos in camp without permission from headquarters.
- 13. Not be authorized to sell items at the 1979 Conclave. I understand that the official Trading Post is the only source of purchasing items.
- 14. Be at all times the considerate guest of a considerate host, the Bob White Lodge and the Georgia-Carolina Council.

ASSEMBLIES (MORNING, MIDDAY AND RETREAT)

These will be brief times with all Conclave delegates together for flag raising, praying the blessing before meals and general announcement periods. Make certain you attend these most important sessions to be held at the Parade Field. Nominations will also be accepted for Section Offices then.

CLOSING ASSEMBLY

The end of our 1979 meeting shall be near during the Closing Assembly. Special parts of this program will include the final candiate nominations; candidate speeches; presentation of awards especially the Sectional Recognition Award; the Final Challenge by Region Chief Jody Clark; farewell address by Section Chief David Surrett and induction of new Section Officers. Selection of the 1980 Conclave site will also be a program item. Do not be one to miss the great end.

ANNUAL ELECTIONS

All candidates for Section Offices are requested to go by Conclave Program Headquarters in the Gu-Que Cabin to register for the election. You will also be given a copy of our 1979 election rules. Make certain you follow them in your campaign. You may register following your formal nomination.

ADMINISTRATIVE NOTES

REGISTRATION - - Lodge Advisers and Lodge Chiefs only need to go through host lodge and program registration respectively. CHECK-OUT - - Lodges must be properly checked out through the host lodge before leaving the Camp. Make certain of this. SECURITY - - Security stations are located outside of the Gu-Que Cabin and next to the Central Showers for your assistance. FIRST AID - - The Health Lodge is being staffed by members of the North Augusta-Belvedere Rescue Squad. The Health Lodge is located next to the Trading Post in the Administration Building in the central camp area.

SUPPLIES DISTRIBUTION - - Speciality item orders for each lodge may be picked up by Lodge Advisers on Saturday morning after 9:30 a.m. from the Trading Post.

SHOWERHOUSE - - Two hot water showerhouses are located in the Camp for your use. One is east of the Dining Hall and the other, Centeral Showers is on top of the hill on the main road. DINING HALL AND KITCHEN - - The camp Kitchen is off limits for all Conclave delegates except the Kitchen staff. The special competition displays are open at all times on the east side of the Dining Hall for your yiewing pleasure.
