The 1956 Fellowship Conference of Area 6-D will get underway at Camp Osborn the afternoon of April 27.

The Immokolee Lodge will be host to you and 249 other Arrowmen for three days of fellowship highlighted by a closing challenge by our beloved Regional Executive W. A. Dobson.

PROGRAM

From the registration Friday afternoon from 2:30 to 5:00 until the final session Sunday morning, the program will be full of activities, ceremonies, movies, campfire programs, discussion groups, swimming, canoeing, fishing, and a Saturday afternoon of planned recreation. Beginning with an Adventure Circus, we will be privileged to learn Indian dances from Hen Henning of the National Staff and games and ceremonies of the Creek Indians from Dr. Fairbanks of Florida State University.

DISCUSSION GROUPS

There will be periods for discussion of every phase of the Order of the Arrow and you should be prepared to be sure that you have at least one representative in each discussion group.

CAMPFIRE

There will be two Fellowship Campfires in which we hope everyone will have an opportunity to participate.

FOOD

The Host Lodge has promised that there will be plenty of food served in a modern up-to-date dining hall, prepared by the chef who has been operating the Council Camp Kitchen for

the past five years and she knows the appetites of young men.

ACCOMMODATIONS

All Arrowmen except those from far away Waguli Lodge must prove that they are campers by bringing their own camping equipment. All leaders will be provided for with shelter and will not have to bring their tents.

WHAT TO BRING

Bring your Scout uniform and Arrow sash, bedroll, fishing tackle, overnight tent, toilet kit and towel, swimming trunks, pencil and scratch pad, extra spending money for trading post and extra patches, Indian costume (if you have one) and medical examination blank (for those who desire to swim.) The total cost will be \$5.00 for each delegate. This includes conference meals and one emblem.

All Lodges must send registration fee to the Host Lodge by April 21. You must send at least \$2.50 per delegate or you can send the entire \$5.00. Each member planning to go should remit his fee to his local Council Office not later than ^{April} March 17 so that the reservations can be forwarded by the 21st. This is the only way the Host Lodge has to determine the amount of food to purchase.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

Scouts will have an opportunity to attend the services of their faith.

This will be your conference. We want everyone to enjoy

South Georgia and we know that you will come prepared to have a good time and exchange ideas.
