ARROWMAN ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The Arrowman Achievement Award is a new program designed for the local Lodge Arrowman (youth only) to assist him in self-improvement. It is composed of three sections of achievement:

- 1. Lodge Development.
- 2. Personal Development.
- 3. Unit and Community Development. Each of these sections has four (4) activities of which three (3) must be accomplished to sucessfully complete the Development. This program is designed so that the arrowman must take at least six (6) months, but not more than one (1) year to complete it. To make this self-improvement more meaningful, a patch will be given to the Arrowman, upon successful completion of the development, by the Lodge.

A contest is to be held to develop the patch to be given. This contest is also restricted to the youth Arrowman. The winning design will be selected at the June Service Weekend. Tong of Albany, Beorgia.


Immokalee Lodge is proud to have the Tong Scouts among its membership.
