## IMMOKALEE LODGE RECEIVES \$2000 GRANT

Each year, the National Order of the Arrow Committee awards individual Lodges up to \$5000 in matching grants. To receive one of these grants, a lodge must submit a proposal to use the money to enhance Boy Scouting or Cub Scouting in the council or camp. This year we submitted a proposal to build a Cub Scout Camp at Camp Osbom and requested \$2000.

We were one of only twelve lodges awarded grants. There were 70 lodges that submitted requests. We have to match this amount and the work must be completed this year. We plan to start work at the Spring Fellowship, March 23-25.
