LODGE SERVICE AWARD

For a number of years, out lodge has given out a service flap to those members who have given various types of service to the lodge. The service has varied from year to year and the Lodge Executive Committee has made the award at the end of the lodge year. In 2006 no Service Awards were given because the LEC was debating on the requirements. The requirements have been finalized and are listed on the lodge website and below. Individual members must keep up with the requirements and turn the completed form in to the LEC by December first of each year.

To earn this award individual members must complete the following requirements in one year: January 1st to the December Banquet. Individual members must keep up with the requirements themselves. Completed forms must be turned into the Lodge Executive Committee at least one week prior to the Lodge Banquet.

- 1. Attend at least one Lodge Ordeal Weekend
- 2. Attend 3 of the following events:
 - a. A second Ordeal Weekend
 - b. Lodge Banquet
 - c. Lodge Winter Fun Fellowship
 - d. Section Conclave
 - e. Endurance Ride
 - f. Serve as an Elangomat
 - g. Any other Lodge event not listed
- 3. Participate in the One Day of Service Project
- 4. Be active in his unit as certified by his Scoutmaster

The Lodge Chief, Lodge Adviser or Staff Adviser must approve and sign all completed Lodge requirements.

The form can be printed from the lodge website.

EXCEPTIONAL FIRST YEAR ARROWMAN AWARD

For the past couple of years the Lodge Executive Committee has been discussing an award for new lodge members that will hopefully increase participation by new Ordeal Members. The requirements of this award have now been finalized and the requirements are listed on the lodge website (www.immokalee353.org) and below. Any lodge member is eligible until December 1, 2007. After that date only new Ordeal members will be eligible. At this time, the Lodge Executive Committee has not decided what will be awarded to those who receive this award. Requirements completed must be kept by the member. A T-shirt has been discussed.

New members may earn this award the first year after induction into the Lodge. Completed forms must be turned into the Lodge Executive Committee at least one week before the first anniversary of induction:

- 1. Attend an Ordeal, other than his own.
- 2. Attend 3 of the following events:
 - a. Lodge Banquet
 - b. Lodge Winter Fun Fellowship
 - c. Section Conclave
 - d. One Day of Service Project
 - e. Endurance Ride
- 3. Be active in his unit as certified by his Scoutmaster

The 'OLD OWLS'

Rick Waitsman is the second in our series of biographies of the early members of Immokalee Lodge. We appreciate Rick volunteering.

The Immokalee 'Old Owl' for this edition is Rick Waitsman an Eagle Scout from Troop 21 in Americus. Rick cheerfully went through his ordeal in the lovely Camp Osborn summer heat and humidity on July 10th, 1965.



In 1966 Rick was selected as one of four scouts from Chehaw Council to attend the 12th World Jamboree. The photo is his World Jamboree photograph.

After high school in Americus, Rick attended Emory University and later graduated cum laude from Boston University School of Law.

He is currently a Administrative Law Judge (federal) with the Social Security Administration in Atlanta. He has been a judge since 1994, first serving in Shreveport, Louisiana and then Atlanta. Rick has also worked in the Social Security Administration headquarters in Falls Church, Virginia. Prior to becoming a judge, Rick was a trail attorney specializing in Medicare and Medicaid fraud and abuse litigation.

In both 1991 and 1993 Rick was awarded the Inspector General's Integrity award. In 2004, the Georgia Senate recognized Rick for his public service.

Currently Rick lives in metro Atlanta with his wife Mindy, and two daughters Melissa, who is a senior at Rice University in Houston and Lily Sara, who is a senior at Lakeside High School.
