In September, Order of the Arrow Key Volunteer Jeffrey St. Cyr joined us to discuss the finer points of the editing process. He brought with him vast experience from his work with the national Order of the Arrow communications team, where he served as layout editor and currently serves as adviser to the national OA bulletin.

His presentation focused on two main subtopics, the first of which was editing vs. proofreading. The second part of the webinar focused on resources used by the national communications team. He shared items relating to Order of Arrow publication layout, formatting, and branding.



In the past, a large portion of Order of the Arrow data was stored on record cards. As time passed, these cards were lost. That was until national committeeman Bill Topkis asked OA Team Specialist, Matt Dukeman, if he had seen anything similar

to the then only known surviving card, which was for Papago Lodge 494. Matt instantly recognized the card and passed the lot of them along to the Order of the Arrow's digital archivist, Tracy Mesler. All of the records have been scanned, and PDFs of the cards are available to lodge historians upon request. You can also be sent the cards for predecessor lodges.

As can be seen in the photo, the top of the card includes lodge name and number, council name, original charter date and description of lodge totem. For the years 1951-1964 there are pieces of data filled in for lodge chief name and address as well as membership breakdowns between Ordeal, Brotherhood, Vigil, new membership, active membership, and a cumulative total. For lodges that do not yet have a complete lodge chief list, this card can potentially fill in some blanks.

What if your lodge already has a complete list of lodge chiefs and knows all the other information on the card? The suggestion is for lodge historians to try and speak with these lodge chiefs as they can serve as a wonderful primary source. Through talking with your previous chiefs, your lodge's historians might be able to uncover leads on further information and stories about your lodge!
