"I will always regard the ties of brotherhood in the Order of the Arrow as lasting....." Do you remember reciting these words during your Ordeal ceremony? There are many ways to ensure the ties of brotherhood remain strong. One way is to continue service to your troop and the Scouts who elected you into the Order of the Arrow. Service to your troop includes setting the best example you can by properly wearing your uniform, living by the Scout Oath and Scout Law, and teaching new members of your troop scouting skills. Another way is to participate in lodge events. Better yet, invite another Arrowman in your troop to join you at a lodge fellowship weekend.

Lodge Event Participation Targets.

These targets are tied to the 2015 lodge goal of strengthening our chapters. The adjacent table shows the number of Arrowmen who attended each 2014 fellowship weekend by chapter (red columns) and the attendance target for our 2015 fellowship weekends (green column). Each 2015 target is a 20% increase from 2014. Arrowman Service Award

The Arrowman Service Award (ASA) is a program to recognize those Arrowmen who seek to recommit themselves to the principles of the Order, support their local units and councils and participate in the centennial celebration. Arrowmen who earn the award will be able to wear the official ASA patch directly on their sash. Arrowmen, both youth and adult, must work to complete a set of requirements across three categories to earn the award. ASA requirement cards are available at any lodge functions or on the lodge website at www.withlacoocheelodge.org. Arrowman working towards the ASA must present his completed requirement card with all supporting signatures to the lodge adviser. The lodge adviser is the key person to determine if the requirements have been met successfully, and will grant the award as appropriate. Arrowmen can work towards the Arrowman Service Award until December 31st, 2015.

Becoming a Brotherhood member marks the completion of a member's induction into the Order of the Arrow. If you have been an Ordeal member for more than ten months, you are eligible to take the next step and become a Brotherhood member of Withlacoochee Lodge. The requirements to seal your membership can be found in the *OA Handbook* under **THE CHALLENGES OF BROTHERHOOD MEMBERSHIP**. The next opportunity to become a Brotherhood member will be at the Spring Fellowship Weekend, March 6-8, 2015 at Camp Patten.

OUR 2015 - 2016 LODGE EVENT CALENDAR

Withlacoochee Lodge exists to support South Georgia Council. As such, the lodge event calendar is nested in the council program year calendar. While the dates for all lodge events have not been finalized; 2015 will prove to be an exciting year as we continue to celebrate the Order of the Arrow centennial anniversary. THE CENTENNIAL TOTEM - The wheel symbolizes the never-ending cycle of service in our Order and our united rolling forward motion into the next century. The white arrow on the red background represents the special sashes that participants will receive at the 2015 NOAC. Moreover, the three W's formed by the wheel's spokes and the corners of the triangle represent Wimachtendienk Wingolauchsik Witahemui. Lastly, the triangle in the center is the symbol for the Vigil Honor, our Order's highest membership level. The centennial totem was designed by Nathaniel Kelton. Kelton is from Troop 466 of Huntsville, Alabama and member of Coosa Lodge.

The South Georgia Council will conduct the National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) course May 31 through June 6, 2015 at Camp Osborn. NYLT is the highest level of youth leadership training available through a council and the ideal leadership training for youth Arrowmen. NYLT is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use in their home troops and in other situations demanding leadership of self and others. The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must BE, what he must KNOW, and what he must DO. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills

come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership. The course curriculum is delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a fun environment. Interconnecting concepts and work processes are introduced early, built upon, and aided by the use of memory aids, which allows participants to understand and employ the leadership skills much faster. NYLT participants will be engaged in a unified approach to leadership that will give them the skill and confidence to lead well. Through a wide range of activities, games, and adventures, participants will work and play together as they put into action the best Scouting has to offer. The best part of NYLT is that many of the NYLT staff are Withlacoochee Lodge Arrowmen so participants will be learning from the best Scouts in the council. CENTENNIAL QUIZ - Test your knowledge of the OA's founding fathers.

1. The Order of the Arrow was founded by E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson. Both were on staff at Treasure Island Scout Camp, a 50 acre island on the Delaware River leased by the Philadelphia Council. What was E. Urner Goodman's volunteer Scouting position when not on camp staff?

2. Carroll Edson has always been an advocate for youth. While studying civil engineering at Dartmouth College he worked summers at this camp?

3. After 14 years of exemplary service as the Scout Executive in Philadelphia and Chicago, Goodman served as National Program Director at the National Council Staff headquartered in New York City. Goodman is credited with establishing what two important Scouting programs during his tenure as Program Director?

4. When the U.S. entered WW I in the spring of 1917, Carroll Edson was appointed a 2nd Lieutenant in the U.S. Army infantry. He served in numerous demanding positions throughout his military career on active duty and in the reserves. In 1931, he was assigned to this nearby military installation.

5. In 1947, while on a ship in route to the World Scout Jamboree in France, E. Urner Goodman was made an adopted member and honorary chief of this Native American Indian Tribe.

6. Goodman and Carroll got along well as a team and had much in common. Although Goodman was the visionary and Edson was more practical; they shared the same values in faith, family, and service to others. At the time they founded the Order of the Arrow they were both 24 years old. As they grew older, each had served in the U.S. Army, established families, and watched their children grow and thrive. Two men that had given so much to boys for so many years also share this sorrowful loss.
