NEWS FROM SECTION SR-9

The Section SR-9 leadership has been closely following the news covering the tornado damage at Camp Osborn and have offered their support and encouragement as we restore the camp facilities and move forward to rebuild. Our lodge leadership has been working with the section leadership to develop a plan for future section events that were to be hosted by Withlacoochee Lodge. In order to allow us to focus our efforts on Camp Osborn service projects, Section SR-9 has relieved Withlacoochee Lodge from their 2018 Heartland Gathering service lodge responsibilities until the 2020 Heartland Gathering. This will give us more time and resources to assist in restoring Camp Osborn without the competing priority of preparing Camp Patten for the 2018 Heartland Gathering.

The LEC has been very aggressive planning camp improvement projects to make Camp Patten the best it can be for the Heartland Gathering and some Arrowmen may be disappointed by this change in service lodge rotation. The good news is that Withlacoochee will be the 2019 Indian Winter service lodge and will now have the opportunity to act as the service lodge for the 2020 Heartland Gathering. With the 2018 National Order of the Arrow Conference at Indiana University, the 2019 Section SR-9 Indian Winter at Camp Patten, and the 2020 Section SR-9 Heartland Gathering, the Arrowmen of Withlacoochee Lodge have exciting opportunities for years to come!

SCOUTING'S NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

South Georgia Council was selected by the national Order of the Arrow committee to receive a \$1,000.00 service grant for Camp Patten to prepare the property for future Section SR-9 events. "This is the second OA service grant our council has received and we are very honored" said Mr. Merrill Dickinson, Lodge Adviser. "The first service grant, in 2013, was used to help fund the remodeling of the old staff pavilion at Camp Osborn into the Burrow", he added.

One of the four fold purposes of the Order of the Arrow is "to crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others." It is with this spirit of cheerful service to others that the OA proudly offers the matching service grant program. Camp Osborn was severely damaged by two consecutive tornados on January 2 and January 22. Damage to the camp facilities and trees is extensive and it will take many months before the camp can be used. Nearly every building was damaged or destroyed by the EF1 tornado that struck main camp. The OA Burrow has significant damage to the roof and water damage to the structure. The second tornado, which was an EF3, skirted main camp but destroyed hundreds of acres of timber in the camp's back country. Many more trees on the ridge and other buildings on main camp were lost due to powerfully destructive winds.

There are months of heavy work to be done by

professionals at Camp Osborn before it is safe for Scouts.

After the timber salvage and stump removal, the power lines have to be buried, the water service restored, the roads repaired, and parking lots reconstructed. When the property is restored to a safe condition, Arrowmen will have many opportunities to provide meaningful service to rebuild our beautiful Camp Osborn. Tough times don't last. Tough people do.
