Developing Youth Leadership Conference National Leadership Seminar

The Developing Youth Leadership Conference (DYLC) and the National Leadership Seminar (NLS) are two unique opportunities for adults and youth to participate in training that is offered only through the Order of the Arrow that are hosted by the Southern Region of the Order of the Arrow.

DYLC is for adults to deepen an adviser's capacity to develop youth leadership within the lodge and chapter. Conference topics will include fostering a growth mindset, promoting resilience, providing constructive feedback that leads to changes in youth behavior and creating a life-long coaching/mentoring relationship.

NLS is for youth and is a weekend conference focusing on the skills and characteristics of leadership. It is intended primarily to enhance the leadership skills of the Order of the Arrow's key youth, as they seek to improve their service to the Boy Scouts of America and the greater community.

The next DYLC and NLS will be held very close to us at the Life Enrichment Center in Fruitland Park, FL on September 8-10, 2017. The cost for each course is \$210.00 but partial scholarships may be available for youth wanted to attend NLS. Additional information is available at http://southern.oa-bsa.org.

Do You Know the History of the OA?

In 1915, Camp Director E. Urner Goodman and Assistant Camp Director Carroll A. Edson searched for a way to recognize select campers for their cheerful sprits of service at Treasure Island Scout Camp in the Delaware River. Goodman and Edson founded the Order of the Arrow when they held the first Ordeal Ceremony on July 16th of that year. By 1921, as the popularity of the organization spread to other camps, local lodges attended the first national gathering called a Grand Lodge Meeting.

The Order of the Arrow was one of many camp honor societies that existed at local Scout camps across the country. As the years went on and more camps adopted the Order of the Arrow's program, it gained prominence and became part of the national Boy Scout program in 1934. By 1948, the OA, recognized as the BSA's national brotherhood of honor campers, became an official part of the Boy Scouts of America. Toward the end of the twentieth century, the OA expanded its focus to include conservation, high adventure, and servant-leadership.

Throughout the years, the Order of the Arrow has played an integral role in the program of the Boy Scouts and in the community service its members contribute to their communities. To date, more than one million people have been members of the Order of the Arrow.

Presently, the Order of the Arrow consists of nearly 300 lodges, which form approximately 48 sections in four regions. Leadership positions and voting rights are restricted to members under the age of 21. Through the program, members live up to the ideals of brotherhood, cheerfulness, and service set forth by E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson.



Withlacoochee Lodge is accepting Vigil Honor nominations until 6:00 PM, Monday, September 18, 2017. Any member of Withlacoochee Lodge in good standing (dues paid) may nominate an eligible Arrowman to the Vigil Honor. To make a nomination, complete the nomination form and mail or e-mail the form to Associate Lodge Adviser, Mr. Rick Green at the address below. Any member in good standing (dues paid) in Withlacoochee Lodge who has held the Brotherhood honor for at least two years as of September 23, 2017 is eligible for nomination to the Vigil Honor. The Outstanding Arrowman Award recognizes Arrowmen who make contributions to the lodge, support its programs, and uphold the principles in the Order of the Arrow Obligation. The Withlacoochee Lodge Outstanding Arrowman Award is a special lodge patch for active (current year's dues paid) youth and adult Arrowman. The period to earn the Outstanding Arrowman Award corresponds to the lodge's program year which starts at the lodge's summer fellowship in August and ends at the Section SR-9 Heartland Gathering in mid-April. The contributions must be completed in one single program year. The Lodge Chief will

formally present the Outstanding Arrowman Award to the recipient at a lodge event. Recipients will have an opportunity to purchase one additional Outstanding Arrowman Award patch when they receive their first award. Subsequent Outstanding Arrowman Awards after the first award will be in the form of a distinctive pin that can be displayed on the patch. ANNUAL LODGE DUES

Annual lodge dues will increase from \$10.00 to \$15.00 per year effective January 1st, 2018. The decision to increase the annual dues was in response to a national dues increase from \$3.00 to \$5.00. Members can pay \$10.00 for their 2018 annual dues before the end of 2017 prior to the increase to \$15.00 on January 1st, 2018 if they so desire. Members may pay their lodge dues at Albany Scout Shop or South Georgia Council Service Center or through the mail by sending a check to the South Georgia Council Service Center.
