NOAC 2018

The 2018 National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC) will be held at Indiana University in Bloomington, Indiana July 30 through August 4, 2018. The National Order of the Arrow Conference is Scouting's second-largest national program event. Youth involvement ensures that the conference program will be exciting, relevant, and non-stop fun. The conference fee is \$525.00 plus our transportation costs which will include a bus or van and hotel rooms. Participants will return home with:

- Name A deeper understanding of the Scout Oath, Scout Law, Order of the Arrow Obligation.
- A renewed spirit, pride, and enthusiasm for Scouting and the Order of the Arrow.
- Ideas their lodge can use to better serve Scouting at the unit, district, and council levels.
- New programs, knowledge, and skills to improve lodge and chapter operations.
- Enhanced leadership skills and a better understanding of how to carry out the work of the lodge.
- The latest information on outdoor and high-adventure and how to successfully promote camping.
- New friendships with fellow Arrowmen from throughout the nation.

The contingent size for Withlacoochee Lodge is 12 youth and 3 adults. Since it is clear that not everyone who wants to attend NOAC will be able to be part of the Withlacoochee Lodge contingent, the LEC is providing some general guidance in composing the lodge's contingent. Specifically,

- Consideration will be given to the contributing 2018 elected lodge officers and chapter chiefs. The elected lodge
 officers are the core of our lodge program. It is important for the key youth to attend NOAC in order to learn ideas to
 strengthen our lodge.
- Consideration will be given to those Arrowmen who demonstrate the commitment and passion to become the next lodge leaders.
- The remaining youth quotas will be reserved for newer Ordeal members who possess great excitement for the OA and, although perhaps are not yet leaders, will be critical for the sustainability of our lodge. We must maintain a steady stream of youth leaders.
- Youth described above contemplating attending NOAC should not base their decision to attend solely on their ability to
 pay the registration fee and transportation costs. A limited number of scholarships are available to selected youth to
 help pay for their transportation costs.
- We will attempt to provide equity amongst our troops and chapters.
- Adults attending NOAC as part of the lodge's contingent will be those with the skills and resources to best serve the lodge.
- Arrowmen who have attended a previous NOAC are encouraged to apply for a NOAC staff position.

Withlacoochee Lodge Arrowmen who will attend NOAC will be registered by the NOAC Contingent Adviser through the national registration system since individual registrations will not be accepted. Additional information on NOAC 2018 can be found on oa-bsa.org.

Withlacoochee Lodge Officer Elections

Elections for the 2018 Chief, Vice-Chief of Program, Vice-Chief of Administration, Secretary and Treasurer will be conducted on Sunday morning November 12th during our lodge meeting at our Fall Inductions weekend at Camp Patten. Arrowmen desiring to serve as a Lodge Officer must meet the mandatory eligibility requirements as stated in the current printing of the Order of the Arrow *Guide for Officers and Advisers*:

- a. Be registered in Scouting, in the council that charters the lodge.
- b. Be a member in good standing in the lodge.
- c. Be younger than 21 for the entire term of service.

All nominees shall have the willingness to fulfill the duties of the position and attend the Lodge Executive Committee meetings. No experience is necessary.

All nominees must agree to attend the next Lodge Leadership Development course near the start of their term of service and consider attending the next available National Leadership Seminar. Per the Withlacoochee Lodge by-laws, all candidates must meet with the Lodge Adviser prior to nomination to ensure he meets the eligibility requirements and discuss responsibilities and expectations of that office. The candidate must get the approval of the Lodge Adviser in order to run for office. Candidates should have held a conference with their Scoutmaster to discuss the duties and obligations of the Arrowman to their unit and the duties and responsibilities of the Lodge Office and review potential conflicts as well as benefits to the unit.

ANNUAL LODGE DUES

Annual lodge dues will increase from \$10.00 to \$15.00 per year effective January 1st, 2018. Members can pay \$10.00 for their 2018 annual dues before the end of 2017 prior to the increase to \$15.00 on January 1st, 2018 if they so desire.
